STUDY PURPOSE

The purpose of the study:

- is to talk with groups of HBCU students to understand their academic needs as Social Work, Psychology, and Counselor Education students,
- to understand the students' attitudes toward Social Work, Psychology, Marriage and Family Therapy, and Counseling as a profession,
- to understand the best way to inform the student of the benefits of a career in Social Work, Psychology, Marriage and Family Therapy, or Counseling and attract them to getting their Clinical License as a Licensed Clinical Social Worker, Licensed Professional Counselor, or Licensed Marriage and Family Therapist,
- and to understand how to retain the student to get them to graduate once they decide on one of these programs.

PROCEDURES FOR THE STUDY:

If you agree to be in the study:

Students will be asked to volunteer to participate in this study by signing and returning this consent form. As part of this study, 60 students will be placed in a focus group of approximately 10 students per group. A moderator will ask several open-ended questions while facilitating the discussion. The focus group will be video recorded via Zoom or another video conferencing service. Face-to-face focus groups may occur based on Virginia State University and CDC COVI policy. If face-to-face contact occurs, a meeting room setting on the campus of Virginia State University with be the site location. If you begin the process, you may stop at any time you feel uncomfortable.

40 Students will also be asked to participate in a one-time online survey which takes approximately 15 minutes to complete. You have the option to participate in the focus group and the online survey. If you begin the process, you may stop at any time.

RISKS OF TAKING PART IN THE STUDY:

- The risk of participation in the study is minimum; however, students completing the survey or participating in the focus group may a be uncomfortable answering the questions.
- The is a risk of possible loss of confidentiality. Students will be told not to share information outside the group but, ultimately, we cannot guarantee all students will abide by the rule,

While participating in the focus group, you can tell the researcher you feel uncomfortable or do not care to answer a particular question.

IN CASE OF INJURY:

In the event of physical injury resulting from your participation in this research, necessary medical treatment will be provided to you and billed as part of your medical expenses. Costs not covered by your health care insurer will be your responsibility. Also, it is your responsibility to determine the extent of your health care coverage. There is no program in place for other monetary compensation for such injuries. However, you are not giving up any legal rights or benefits to which you are otherwise entitled.
